Founded in 1993, the Hempfield Foundation is an independent not-for-profit organization that supports the educational mission of the Hempfield School District through grants and scholarships.

Hempfield Foundation awards 48 grants totaling nearly \$100,000!

During the 2022-2023 school year, the Hempfield Foundation funded projects in all school buildings with several grants impacting multiple schools. Awarded grants include:

- \$26,264 for Elementary and Middle School Reading
- \$18,396 for Elementary, Middle, and High School STEAM
- \$17,859 for Elementary, Middle, and High School Art & Music
- \$16,129 for Middle and Elementary School English Language Arts
- \$11,131 for Special Education, Emotional & Other Support Programs
- \$9,900 for Health/Physical Education, Library, Technology Education and other initiatives

The Foundation's teacher grant program is funded through contributions from a diverse group of donors, including those who participate in the Commonwealth's Educational Improvement Tax Credit (EITC) program. Contributors can receive a tax credit valued up to 90% of their investment in the Foundation. 

Foundation Provides \$13,000 to HHS **Music Department for New Pianos**

In August, the Hempfield School Board approved the Foundation's gift of more than \$13,000 to allow the Hempfield High School music department to purchase 10 new electric pianos, including two that can be used for off-campus performances. This funding also includes stands, benches, and some small pieces of recording equipment. In all, these new pianos will benefit 350 band, choir, and orchestra students each year.



Hempfield Woman's Club Legacy Fund


After nearly 60 years of service to the Hempfield community, the Hempfield Woman's Club disbanded in September. In one of the group's last acts of official business, the club contributed its remaining fund balance of \$8,483 to the Foundation. The Foundation will be using these monies to establish the Hempfield Woman's Club Legacy Fund and will use its proceeds to fund selected teacher grant applications. The Foundation is proud to honor the tremendous work done by so many remarkable women in the community.

First Annual Bookmark Contest Held to Celebrate Read Across America Week

After more than 500 entries and several days of enthusiastic public voting in February, the Hempfield Foundation was pleased to congratulate Emily George from Mountville Elementary School and Emma Keller from Landisville Middle School as the elementary and middle school winners of the Foundation's 2023 Read Across America Bookmark Contest.

Both students created terrific designs that remind everyone just how important reading is. This contest was made possible thanks to the tremendous support of HSD elementary & middle school librarians, art teachers, and staff.

The Foundation provided the winning bookmarks to all elementary and middle school students as well as the Mountville branch of the Lancaster Public Library.





Bringing Folks to the Table Throughout the Year

During the 2022-23 school year, the Foundation invited members of the Hempfield community to join them around the table at a variety of events:

- In December 2022, the Hempfield Foundation welcomed shoppers, handed out tote bags and wrapped gifts at our table during the annual Hempfield Holiday Shoppe. Thanks to generous donations from shoppers eager to get their gifts wrapped, the Foundation raised almost \$100 for the Help Thy Neighbor Fund—a program established by social workers in the Hempfield School District to help Hempfield families in need.
- In March and April, the Foundation set up its table to welcome all those members of the Hempfield community who are 65+ as the annual sponsor of Senior Preview Night for the spring musical, Peter Pan, and the 2023 Dance Theater production, Timewarp.
- In April, the Foundation had a table during the **Future Learning Fair** where Hempfield juniors and seniors had the opportunity to learn more about Hempfield Foundation scholarships.

Hempfield Foundation Helps Alumni Celebrate Milestone Reunions

In May and September, the Foundation supported reunion activities for the HHS Classes of 1972 and 2013. The Class of 1972 was honored during this year's commencement ceremonies, and the Foundation sponsored a reception for class members immediately prior to graduation.
